
An exciting city walk in the history of Athens through Stamps


Among the several monuments, we will be guided in the Panathinaikon Stadium narrating the history of the Olympic Games, and the commemorative issues of

Zappeio, the building hosting the NOTOS 2021, will be offer us the opportunity to talk about the Greek benefactors that were depicted on in the Greek stamps. The New Acropolis Museum, the statue of Maria Kallas, the Herodion are among the monuments that will allow us to discover the Greek way of thinking that had an impact on philately as well.
